Stephen Brown is recently retired from the Federal Reserve Bank of Dallas, where he served as the director of energy economics and microeconomic policy. His work was instrumental in building the Dallas Fed's reputation for excellence in energy economics. He is widely recognized for his knowledge of world energy markets and the effects of energy price shocks on economic activity. Steve holds a B.S. in economics from California Polytechnic State University and an M.A. and Ph.D. in economics from the University of Maryland.

Steve's work has encompassed a broad balance of economic research, analysis, communication, leadership and public service. He is the author of more than 100 economics articles, published in academic journals and Dallas Fed publications. Steve has presented testimony to Congress and to several State of Texas Commissions. He has spoken before numerous high level groups, including members of the British Parliament. He also has extensive media experience, appearing in *Business Week*, *The Economist*, *Financial Times*, *Newsweek*, *The New York Times*, *Time*, and *The Wall Street Journal*.

Steve is an associate editor for the journal *Energy Economics* and previously served as an editor for the Dallas Fed's publications *Southwest Economy* and *Economic and Financial Policy Review*. He also has participated in numerous studies of the Energy Modeling Forum at Stanford University, and he is currently serving on the American Statistical Association's advisory board for the U.S. Energy Information Administration. Steve taught at Southern Methodist University and Tulane University concurrently with his employment at the Federal Reserve Bank of Dallas.
