Curtis Frasier is Executive Vice President, Americas of Royal Dutch Shell's global Gas & Power business and a member of the U.S. Leadership Team. He is currently located in Houston, Texas and has been in his current position since January 2006.

A native of Tempe, Ariz., Mr. Frasier received his bachelor's degree from Arizona State University in 1977 and his Juris Doctor from the University of Tulsa in 1982. He joined Houston-based Shell Oil Company's Legal Organization in 1982, working various assignments in commercial, finance and international law. In 1990, he transferred to the Legal Organization of Shell International Petroleum Company in London, and in 1992 became Secretary to the Royal Dutch/ Shell Committee of Managing Directors.

Mr. Frasier returned to Houston in 1994 as Manager Supply Operations, Shell Oil Products Company. He subsequently led Shell's Gulf of Mexico growth initiative, which resulted in the formation of Shell Midstream Enterprises in 1996. He was appointed President of Shell Midstream Enterprises in 1997.

Beginning in 1998, Mr. Frasier held various positions in Shell's expanded Midstream and Gas & Power businesses. He served as Chief Operating Officer of Tejas Gas Corporation and subsequently became President Energy Services, following integration of the Midstream assets into Shell's Coral Energy affiliate. In 2002, he moved to The Hague to serve as General Counsel of Royal Dutch Shell's global E&P business.
